

Practicum Placement Options: Adult Outpatient All Practicum Psych Students, LCSW or MFT Interns have a primary assignment to one clinical service setting throughout the year. They will typically be assigned outpatient psychotherapy cases and other activities will vary with their primary clinical service. All students will have 1 hour of individual supervision by a licensed primary supervisor and regular practicum group supervision with a licensed psychologist. A third hour of individual supervision or conjoint therapy or supervision with the clinical team also occurs in most weeks. Students will have the option of a 3 month, 4-hour per week rotation on PES beginning in January. **All practicum students must be on site on Fridays** for the Allied Clinical Services Seminar and trainees peer support group. They also need to be present for the designated days for their selected clinical team as listed below. **All practicum placements require a minimum of 20 hours per week, typically over three days.**

Training events on Wednesday and Friday at Bon Air. 	<p>Dialectical Behavior Therapy: Students who are available on Wednesdays can participate in the DBT Case Consultation Group and may be assigned individual DBT clients and/or assist in leading DBT Skills Groups if their time and caseloads can accommodate this.</p> <p>Testing: <u>While testing opportunities are available they are limited, typically to one or two batteries in the year.</u></p>
